**The White Ribbon Campaign (WRC) is a worldwide effort of men ending violence, particularly violence against women. Wearing a white ribbon is a symbol of opposition to violence and a "personal pledge to never commit, condone, or remain silent about violence against women and girls." This goal is accomplished in five ways:**

- 1. Challenging everyone to speak out, and think about their own beliefs, language and actions.**
- 2. Educating young people, especially young men and boys, on the issue through educational resources.**
- 3. Raising public awareness of the issue.**
- 4. Working in partnership with women's organizations, the corporate sector, the media and other partners to create a future with no violence against women.**
- 5. Supporting WRCs with our experience, resources and networks.**
