GLOBAL HEALTH INITIATIVE INTERN: POSITION DESCRIPTION

Eligibility:

All rising Dartmouth College sophomores, juniors, and seniors are welcome to apply. The internship commitment varies by term; there will be one intern selected for summer and fall terms, and another intern who will serve Fall, Winter, and Spring for the 2014-2015 year. Students must be on campus for all terms of their internship.

Responsibilities:

The Intern will be responsible for managing student programs, global health projects, and communications at the Global Health Initiative at the Dickey Center. The individual will work closely with Jessica Friedman, the GHI Program Manager, and Dr. Lisa Adams, the Associate Dean of Global Health at the Geisel School of Medicine, within the global health operations arm of the Dickey Center.

The primary responsibilities of the intern are:

- Promote global health fellowships and events on campus and beyond;
- Advise students on global health opportunities at the Dickey Center through the Global Health Initiative and International Internship funding opportunities;
- Co-chair the Global Health Day planning committee;
- Monitor the GHI email account and hold office hours to meet with interested individuals; and
- Market GHI internships, and draft documents and blurbs for the Program Manager.

Ideal applicants have a demonstrated interest in global health and past experience with Dickey Center programs, so they can testify to experiences in the field. Additionally, the Intern must be knowledgeable of other Dickey programs and coordinate with the other Dickey interns to promote opportunities.

Other responsibilities of the intern include designing, organizing, and implementing global health orientation and debriefing programs for students traveling abroad. In the past, interns have also conducted focus groups and ethics training in global health. The Intern will also be responsible for managing a research study involving tuberculosis in international travelers. Collectively, this individual provides a gateway to global health at Dartmouth, and should maintain connections with a variety of contacts and organizations.

The Intern will work for approximately 7-12 hours a week, although the timing may vary depending on the current state of projects at GHI.

Qualifications:

All majors are welcome to apply. Relevant experience in global health is required; this could involve coursework, research, and/or extracurricular involvement in global health activities. Prior field experience (domestically or internationally) is preferred. Applicants should have strong written or oral communication skills, as well as good time-management and organizational skills.
