



Student Global Health Reflection Essay Contest

Over the years, students have reflected on their global health experiences. Through writing, sharing, listening, and storytelling we can begin to derive clarity about the injustice we witness, embrace the complexities of the lives we touch, decipher the ambiguity of moral judgment in widely divergent cultural contexts, and imagine constructive action in response to our experiences. All current undergraduate, graduate and professional school students are invited to submit reflective essays in response to global health experiences- these may be in a research, educational, clinical, or service capacity. Please highlight the impact of your experience on professional development, personal growth or new insights you have gained into cross-cultural or ethical issues.

DEADLINE: All essays must be submitted via email to GHI@Dartmouth.edu by **Monday, April 6, 2015 by 12PM**. Send an email (including information at the bottom of the page) with your essay an attachment. The subject of your email should be “2015 GHD Essay Submission”.

Prizes: Three cash prizes will be awarded to the top three students who are deemed by the faculty and student judges as most worthy based on the guidelines above.

1st place- \$100

2nd place- \$75

3rd place- \$50

REQUIREMENTS FOR ESSAYS:

- The essay must be written while the trainee has student, trainee, or graduate/post-graduate status at a university, must be the work of a single author, and must represent original work. Essays must not have been previously published in print or electronic format.
- Entries must be in English, at least 12 pt. font, doubled-spaced, and must not exceed 750 words.
- Essay should be written in Microsoft or OpenOffice document.
- Only one submission per person.
- Essays not meeting all requirements will be disqualified from the contest.

Please include the following information in the body of your email:

1. First Name, Last Name
2. Title of Essay
3. Email Address
4. Dartmouth Affiliation (Geisel, Undergrad, Tuck, etc.)
5. Essay abstract: 100 word written summary with key aspects of your experience)
6. Degree Program and year
