## **Photo Submission Guidelines**

**DEADLINE**: All photos must be submitted via email to GHI@Dartmouth.edu by Monday, April 6, 2014 by 12PM. Send an email (including information detailed in the guidelines) with your photo(s) as attachment(s).

**Prizes:** Three cash prizes will be awarded to the top three students who are deemed by the faculty and student judges as most worthy based on the guidelines above.

**1st place-** \$100

**2nd place-** \$75

**3rd place-** \$50

#### Some questions to consider:

- Did you obtain verbal or written consent from your subjects (or parents of children)?
- Did your subjects volunteer to be in your photo or to share their experience?
- How close was your relationship with the subjects? Have you remained in contact with them or their community?
- Would your subjects be surprised, offended or embarrassed to see themselves portrayed publicly?
- Does this submission accurately reflect the life and experience of your subjects?

#### **Submission Guidelines:**

Only Dartmouth students and trainees may submit to the contest. Each individual is limited to three entries, either within or between categories.

By submitting to the Dickey Center, you affirm that your work is an ethical, accurate and responsible portrayal of your subjects.

### In the Body of your email include the following:

- 1. First and Last Name
- 2. Dartmouth Affiliation (Graduate, Undergraduate, Medical School, TDI, etc.)

#### For EACH submission please include the following:

- 1. Title of Photograph
- 2. Photo Caption
- 3. Location
- 4. Date taken
- 5. For images containing faces that are capable of bring recognized indicate whether or not you received written or verbal consent to be photographed.
- 6. Abstract: In less than 200 words please describe the events captured in the photo. This may include a description of the health challenges you encountered, your work and

connection to the subjects, additional details about your subjects and reflections about the impact of this experience on you as a student.

### **Photograph Technical Guidelines:**

- 1. Photos may be printed in sizes up to 11x14. For the best resolution and presentation we recommend pixel size of at least 2000x3000. Photos that do not meet resolution requirements will not be considered.
- 2. Format: JPEG only
- 3. No collages will be accepted.
- 4. Digital alteration of photos should not be done/kept to minimum.
- 5. Photos must be from a previous domestic or overseas experience in the past 5 years.
- 6. All submissions must comply with ethical guidelines of The Dickey Center.

#### **Judging Criteria:**

Content (60%): relevance to topic, subject matter, impact on viewer, creativity, storytelling or description.

Presentation (40%): composition, exposure, focus, color, lighting, etc.
