Sustainable Moving Sale Work Crew

The Moving Sale Work Crew is the heart and soul of the Sustainable Moving Sale – one of our biggest and most visible events! The Sale repurposes dorm items donated by Dartmouth students for resale to incoming freshmen. In addition to tackling a huge waste problem on campus and raising money (lots!) for student grants, the Sale is an opportunity to welcome incoming freshmen to the sustainability community. The Moving Sale Crew will work as a team, 1-3 times per week, for a set period of time at the Moving Sale warehouse, under the guidance of our awesome Sustainable Moving Sale Managers. The group will clean, sort, organize, and test merchandise to be sold in the fall. Seeking can-do, action-oriented, team members who enjoy the glamorous work of lifting and cleaning mini-fridges, spontaneous dance parties, and dips in the river!

Dartmouth Bikes Mechanics

Dartmouth Bikes is the Sustainability Office's student run bike program on campus. Dartmouth Bikes strengthens our campus bike culture, enforces the campus bike policy, and keeps student, faculty, and staff bikes happy, moving, and out of the landfill! The Dartmouth Bikes Mechanics drive this program. Specific tasks include working weekly in our Bike Shop to fix customer bikes and refurb abandoned bikes for resale, tagging abandoned bikes on campus and following confiscation procedures, hosting and supporting biking related events, and supporting the existing Dartmouth Bikes rentals programs. These interns play an integral role in reducing bike waste on campus and improving transportation options. Bike mechanic skills required (but we can help teach you!).

Farm Interns

Ready to work hard outside, eat delicious, sun warmed, local food, swim in the river, learn about growing vegetables, and make Dartmouth a global, sustainability leader? Interns will perform necessary work in production fields and greenhouses. Day to day activities include necessary seeding, weeding, transplanting, watering, pest prevention, harvesting and more. Farm interns will oversee marketing of vegetables to Dartmouth Dining Services and other area clients and will also support our collaboration with the Claremont Soup Kitchen and Rethink Health. These efforts will include vegetable washing, sorting, weighing, invoicing and delivery. Farm interns support student volunteers, PE classes, and other visitors to the farm through guiding and supervising work, giving tours, and running educational workshops. During the summer term, each farm intern is responsible for organizing at least 1 Dartmouth community outreach event of your choosing/creation (a movie screening, workshop, tour for staff, tilapia chowder fest etc.) Are you ready to learn about sustainability, integrated food and energy systems, compost, tomatoes, herbs, bees, soil and more? This is the position for you! Previous food and agriculture experience a plus, but not necessary! Can lift 50 lbs.

2-3 interns, 6-8 hours per week, \$10 per hour.
