# **Spring Farm Intern**

Goals:

- Support spring farm operations including soil blocking, seeding, fish care & aquaponics system set-up, irrigation, production field prep, green house prep, building upkeep, and bee hive start-up.
- Instruct weekly Farm Fit PE class & lead volunteers participating in work days.
   Serve as a resource to users stopping by during weekly Open Hours.
- Maintain clean, organized, aesthetically pleasing, and accessible farm spaces and infrastructure.
- Suggest and pilot programs, workshops, infrastructure changes and events to increase & deepen student, faculty, and staff engagement with the farm. This may include social and more academically oriented events.
- Support events including barn & fire pit rentals, open houses, tours, farm user meetings, Brewhaha, etc.
