I'm pleased to announce that the **first installment of Theta Delta Chi's Speaker Series** is coming up this week! Our first speakers are two distinguished Dartmouth alumni that have years of experience in our country's judicial system. Featured in this event is Dartmouth '88 **Josh Stein**, who currently serves as **Attorney General of North Carolina**, and '77 **Tom Barnico**, who served as **Assistant Attorney General for the Commonwealth of Massachusetts** from 1981-2010.

Mr. Stein has served as the 50th Attorney General of North Carolina since 2017. He previously served as a member of the North Carolina Senate representing District 16, located in Wake County. As Attorney General, Stein has sought and received additional funding to test North Carolina's backlog of untested sexual assault kits. In 2019, Stein became the first attorney general in the country to sue e-cigarette manufacturer JUUL for unlawful marketing to minors.



Mr. Barnico is currently an adjunct faculty member at Boston College Law School, teaching the Attorney General Civil Litigation Program and Seminar and the Administrative Law Externship Seminar. Mr. Barnico represented the state and its officers in civil cases involving constitutional law, administrative law, and business regulation. He has argued three cases in the United States Supreme Court, 18 cases in the United States Court of Appeals for the First Circuit, and 72 cases in the Supreme Judicial Court of Massachusetts.
