Sustainable Moving Sale Work Crew

The Moving Sale Work Crew is the heart and soul of the Sustainable Moving Sale – one of our biggest and most visible events! The Sale repurposes dorm items donated by Dartmouth students for resale to incoming freshmen. In addition to tackling a huge waste problem on campus and raising money (lots!) for student grants, the Sale is an opportunity to welcome incoming freshmen to the sustainability community. The Moving Sale Crew will work as a team, 1-3 times per week, for a set period of time at the Moving Sale warehouse, under the guidance of our awesome Sustainable Moving Sale Managers. The group will clean, sort, organize, and test merchandise to be sold in the fall. Seeking can-do, action-oriented, team members who enjoy the glamorous work of lifting and cleaning mini-fridges, spontaneous dance parties, and dips in the river!

Dartmouth Bikes Mechanics

Dartmouth Bikes is the Sustainability Office's student run bike refurb and sale program on campus. Dartmouth Bikes strengthens our campus bike culture, supports the campus bike policy, and keeps student, faculty, and staff bikes happy, moving, and out of the landfill! The Dartmouth Bikes Mechanics drive this program. Specific tasks include tagging abandoned bikes on campus and following confiscation procedures outlined in the new Bike Policy, working weekly as a team during fixed mechanics hours to refurb confiscated bikes in anticipation of the Sustainable Moving Sale, and supporting the existing Dartmouth Bikes rentals and repair programs. These interns play an integral role in reducing bike waste on campus. Bike mechanic skills required (but we can help teach you!). Up to 3 interns, 5 hours per week. \$10/hr.

Farm Interns

Ready to work hard outside, eat delicious, sun warmed, local food, swim in the river, learn about growing vegetables, and help make Dartmouth a global, sustainability leader? Seeking part-time farm interns to support our day-to-day growing season farm operations in production fields and two greenhouses. Activities include necessary seeding, weeding, transplanting, watering, pest prevention, harvesting and more. Additionally, farm interns will support increased student, faculty, and staff engagement with the farm, help us develop a new student CSA program, and market farm programs/events to the broader campus community. Seeking a can-do individual who is excited about making the farm an integral part of Dartmouth's sustainability future. Are you ready to learn about sustainability, integrated food and energy systems, compost, tomatoes, soil and more? This is the position for you! Green Greek Intern

During the summer, this intern will focus on building comradery among house sustainability chairs, developing an informational campaign that aligns Sustainability Offices resources with needs within the Greek sustainability community, critically evaluating the current Green Greek program structure and making recommendations for the upcoming year! Additionally, this intern acts as a liaison between Greek houses, the Office of Sustainability and ORL, and serving as a resource for Greek houses trying to reduce their impacts, save money, and be more sustainable!

Sophomore Summer Consulting Project: Snow dragon Intern

This internship is a mini version of the newly launched "Senior Sustainability Consultancy" program. Looking for an internship that will equip you with real world problem solving skills and the ability to manage a client? Seeking a motivated intern equipped with the skills to complete a cost/benefit analysis of 2-3 snow removal options for the college. The analysis would include modeling of financial, environmental, and social costs and benefits comparing our current campus snow removal system (plow snow and truck to distant locations), use of a "[Snow Dragon](#)" to melt plowed snow, and 1-2 other best practices used by cities or universities. This intern would present their final findings and recommendations at the end of the summer to the Director of Sustainability and the Associate Vice President for FO&M. Their recommendations would serve as a starting point for making changes to the college's snow removal policy.

Energy Intern

This intern will continue to support Dartmouth's efforts to get off #6 fuel oil! Are you eager to lend yours and other student voices to one of the biggest sustainability issues on campus? Want to help make sure every student knows where the heating plant is and where our energy comes from? The Energy Intern will develop programming and materials to educate Dartmouth students about the impacts of campus energy usage and work to show student support for switching our fuel supply in the lead up to the September Board of Trustees meeting. We are looking for an individual with creativity, enthusiasm, and passion for getting change done!
